### A Compendium of Modelling Techniques

Details: This Integration Insight provides a brief overview of the most popular modelling techniques used to analyse complex real-world problems, as well as some less popular but highly relevant techniques. The modelling methods are divided into three categories, with each encompassing a number of methods, as follows:

1. Qualitative Aggregate Models (Soft Systems Methodology, Concept Maps and Mind Mapping, Scenario Planning, Causal (Loop) Diagrams),
2. Quantitative Aggregate Models (Function fitting and Regression, Bayesian Nets, System of differential equations / Dynamical systems, System Dynamics, Evolutionary Algorithms) and
3. Individual Oriented Models (Cellular Automata, Micro-simulation, Agent Based Models, Discrete Event Simulation, Social Network Analysis).

Each technique is broadly described with example uses, key attributes and reference material.

Details: *Innovations for Scaling Impact* (iScale) is a "...global network of individuals and organizations committed to developing, implementing and promoting innovations to scale the impact of efforts to address the world's most pressing challenges". The primary focus of iScale crosses five broad areas: (1) peace and security; (2) governance and transparency; (3) environment and climate; (4) health, education and livelihoods; and, (5) business and markets. In engaging with collaborators via action learning and in the development and application of innovations to further impact, iScale uses a variety of mechanisms such as:

- "fostering and supporting multi-actor initiatives, from action-learners and donor collaboratives to cross-sectoral action networks
- facilitating dialogue among practitioners, action-learners, beneficiaries and other stakeholders to share knowledge and develop new understanding
- spurring and supporting policymakers, action-learners, advocates and others working together to advance norms and improve institutions
- employing and advancing innovations such as systems-oriented theories of change and action for organizations and multi-stakeholder initiatives, outcomes mapping, and value network analysis
- integrating meaningful and actionable assessment effectively into programs to support the realization of their greatest impact
- deploying new technologies to expand access to information, foster open governance, and advance collective learning".

## **FEATURED COURSES**

### **Dynamic Modelling: What, Why & How?**

This course, with a focus on health, is based on exploring dynamic modeling and combines different methods including discrete event, system dynamics and agent based simulation. The course is split into a number of components that may be taken separately or together, involving a two day overview, a three day practical training component and a related two day choice behaviour modelling event. The overview is aimed at planners, managers, researchers, practitioners, consultants and policy makers interested in an advanced in-depth overview of dynamic modelling methods, examples of their use and potential. The three day practical component can be added for those students, researchers and modelling practitioners wishing to advance their use of AnyLogic for multi-method modelling. The related event, titled 'choice behaviour modelling and simulation in health: Theory meets data', involves an interactive discussion in a small group setting.

## International Spring University on Ecosystem Services Modeling

"The *International Spring University On Ecosystem Services Modeling* is a two-week intensive course... [which] aims to build a new generation of actors, in research, policy and management, who can effectively use ecosystem services models to address and solve sustainability problems. The participants of the course will learn how to express a problem, ranging from biophysical modeling of ES flow dynamics to the economic and societal consequences of their provision, into a state-of-the-art modeling language. That will allow the problem to be analyzed and simulated under different scenarios... The school will teach participants the use of open source modeling software, enabling participants to independently create, run and analyze models and scenarios. Models developed in this way can also be disseminated and run by remote users through the World Wide Web... [It is expected that the school will] attract practitioners, scientists and decision-makers from around the world".

## Erasmus Mundus European Master Programme in System Dynamics

"The European master programme in System Dynamics is specifically designed for students who are interested in learning how to initiate strategic change in organizations, supported by the use of computer simulation models. With the growing interconnectedness of society and increasing turbulence, organisations in the public and private sectors are continuously confronted with the need for improvement in strategy development, policy design and decision making in and across complex, dynamic domains. History is full of examples where decision makers did not succeed in designing such effective policies... A common denominator here is a lack of understanding of the systems people control: they ignore or misperceive the nature of stocks and flows, feedback loops, delays, and non-linearities. Many such dynamic systems are not yet properly understood... Model based policy analysis and design (with the help of System Dynamics) has long been recognised as a way to help people make better decisions when confronted with the complexity of dynamic systems. [The aim of the programme is to teach participants] how to build a System Dynamics model, how to apply it to a variety of real life problems and how to facilitate the model building process with the client in such a way that not only a high-quality model can be built, but what is equally important is that a strategic change can be achieved and policies can be implemented".
