Welcome to the January - March 2024 i2S News with the latest developments in Integration and Implementation Sciences (i2S), this time from two of the three repositories we curate.

We introduce a new category of blog posts for Integration and Implementation Insights (i2Insights) blog and repository, which we are calling "Editor's Additions." We also highlight statistics about the global nature of views of i2Insights, including that i2Insights contributions have been viewed more than 1.3 million times, and that there are only two countries where i2Insights has never been viewed.

From the i2S-Talks YouTube channel, we feature the playlist from NITRO-Oceania, the Network of Leaders of Interdisciplinary and Transdisciplinary Organisations in the Oceania region, along with two recent videos from seminars organized by that group. This is one of a small number of playlists that we host for sister organisations.

We are rebuilding the main i2S website and there is no news to report this time.

In other updates, Gabriele is pleased to report that she was elected as inaugural President of the Global Alliance for Inter- and Transdisciplinarity (ITD-Alliance) in November 2023. She also had an article published commenting on lack of recognition for transdisciplinarity in a major review of the Australian higher education system released at the end of February.

We also provide news about the International System Dynamics conference and the International Transdisciplinarity conference, both of which will be held later this year. There is also a call for submissions for a special issue of the Higher Education Research and Development journal on "Educating for Societal Transitions" which will be published in 2025.

Introducing "Editor's Additions"

Although i2Inisghts is founded on contributions from the global community of researchers, students and – occasionally - practitioners tackling complex societal and environmental problems, there are times when we, as curators, cannot find authors for tools that would be useful additions to the i2Insights repository. We recognise that not everyone wants to or is able to contribute to i2Insights, and the originators of some classic tools have retired or died. We have therefore decided to introduce a new category of blog posts – "Editor's Additions" – which are accounts of such tools, written by people who are not associated with their development.

The first two-part "Editor's Addition" post has recently been published:

- 1. <u>Competencies for systems thinking practitioners. Part 1: Overall expectations and knowledge</u>
- 2. <u>Competencies for systems thinking practitioners. Part 2: Skills and behaviours</u>

Who can write an "Editor's Addition? While we envisage that most of these blog posts will be written by the two of us who curate i2Insights, we welcome other contributions and invite anyone who wants to share a relevant tool to get in touch (see our contact details at the very end of this News).

For long-term followers of i2S and i2Insights, some historical context may also be helpful. Previously, we would write up and publish such tools in a different repository on the main i2S website. Now that <u>we have dismantled that repository</u> that option is no longer available. What's more, there are still several <u>tools from that repository that the "Editor's Additions" option will allow</u> <u>us to include in i2Insights</u>.

Highlights from i2Insights statistics

The main data collected on readers of i2Insights blog and repository is the country location where i2Insights is viewed. Since i2Insights started in 2015, there have been viewers in 191 of the 193 countries represented at the United Nations. The two missing counties are African Central Republic and San Marino. If you have contacts there, do please introduce them to i2Insights!

By and large, i2Insights is well read in the Global North, with the strongest viewing numbers in the USA, UK and Australia (163,000-303,000 views), which is also where most authors come from. There are also strong viewing numbers and contributions from Canada, Germany, the Netherlands, Switzerland and New Zealand (22,000-65,000). Interestingly, India, the Philippines



and South Africa have strong viewing numbers (43,000-49,000), but no-to-few authors. Strong viewing numbers and no-to-few authors is also the case for Pakistan, Indonesia, Kenya, Ghana, Nigeria and Malaysia (10,000-17,000). We know that there is great work happening in all those countries and we hope you will share it through i2Insights.

And a belated milestone: sometime in 2023 i2Insights reached a million views! By the end of 2023 views were more than 1.3 million.
