This chapter presents the results of a reading, discussion and writing group that examined an eclectic range of literature for insights into improving research—policy interactions. It focuses on 1) how research is used to support policymaking; 2) evaluating research—policy interactions; 3) a range of considerations about the research enterprise, including quality, scope and capacity. The two overall aims are to present a number of interesting ideas that could assist researchers and policymakers to improve their interactions and to highlight aspects of this connection that would benefit from further investigation.

"Analysis of the integration approaches taken by two Australian Cooperative Research Centres - the CRC Tor Greenhouse Accounting and the CRC for Coastal Zone, Estuary and Waterway Management - is used to reflect on (a) six heuristics for understanding integration and (b) a framework of six questions for describing integration. The heuristics are connecting across research silos, a jigsaw, purchaser-provider relationships, extension work, value adding across multiple scales and 'locked door' serendipity. The questions examine what the integration is aiming to achieve, what is being integrated, who is doing the integration and how, and investigating the context for the integration and success measures. Both the heuristics and the questions have broader applications. We also examine what integration in research is, along with contexts in which integration occurs, by examining projects, programs and organisations. We conclude by examining institutional aspects of integration, especially governance, funding and accountability, and incentives"
