Welcome to a new look i2S News and the first for 2022!

We are changing the focus and frequency of i2S News. We are concentrating on the latest developments in Integration and Implementation Sciences (i2S) and aim to publish a News every three months.

The main aim of i2S is to provide theory and resources for improving research impact on complex real-world problems. Our target audience is researchers who tackle complex societal and environmental problems and who are interested in:

- Synthesizing knowledge from different disciplines and stakeholders,
- Understanding and managing diverse unknowns, and
- Supporting improved policy and practice responses to problems by government, business and civil society.

i2S therefore develops new tools, as well as compiling and sharing existing tools, in 11 main areas:

- understanding the processes involved in *change*
- improving *communication*
- understanding *context*
- effective *decision making*
- incorporating, harnessing and managing *diversity*
- *integration* of multiple and varied perspectives about any problem and insights into acting on it
- *research implementation*
- *stakeholder engagement*
- taking a *systems* perspective
- *teamwork*
- understanding and managing *unknowns*.

In highlighting what's new, i2S News provides information and updates about three major repositories that we curate:

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i2S WEBSITE

Changes underway to the i2S website

As well as providing a range of materials about i2S, this website has provided information about tools, journals, professional associations and networks, and conferences. We are in the process of:

- providing more and updated information about i2S through the introduction of a new section of Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ). As FAQ are added to the website, extracts will be provided in i2S News. Extracts from the first two FAQ are provided below.
- moving the tools to i2Insights blog and repository or i2S Talks YouTube channel, or archiving them.
- liaising with another professional association about taking over the currently listed journals, professional associations and networks, and conferences.

Until we find a confirmed home for the journals, professional associations and networks, and conferences, we will continue to maintain those resources, but not add to them.

FAQ: What are the major options for engaging stakeholders (i2S Stakeholder Engagement Options Framework)? (extract)

Key requirements for stakeholder engagement include:

- making available ways for stakeholders to provide: a) perspectives for a more comprehensive understanding of the problem, b) ideas about addressing it, c) insights into how the research can support policy or practice change
- being able to tailor the engagement to the willingness and capacity of the stakeholders to contribute, as well as the resources available to the researchers
- being able to include different stakeholders in different ways, as well as being able to include the same stakeholders in different ways in different parts of a research project
- reciprocity, *ie.*, the engagement also places obligations on the researchers towards the stakeholders.

The i2S stakeholder engagement options framework provides 5 ways for researchers to include stakeholders in a project: inform, consult, involve, collaborate and support. Each comes with a corresponding promise from the researchers to the stakeholders.

FAQ: Where does i2S fit amongst transdisciplinarity, systems thinking, action research and similar research approaches? (extract)

Integration and Implementation Sciences (i2S) aims to be the discipline that underpins a range of research approaches that tackle complex societal and environmental problems. These are approaches that draw on the insights of different disciplines and stakeholders to develop:

1. a more comprehensive understanding of the complex problem, both what is known and unknown
2. more ideas for ways of addressing the problem
3. effective ways of supporting policy makers and practitioners from government, business and civil society in bringing about change to improve the problem.

Twenty-two approaches which i2S draws together are listed. Some aim to be comprehensive, such as transdisciplinarity, systems thinking and action research. Others address only a subset of the three tasks, such as implementation science, which focuses on effective ways of supporting policy and practice change, and the science of team science, which, although relevant to all three tasks, concentrates on the best ways of working together.

The time is right for developing ways of tackling complex problems that bring these different approaches together, as well as identifying and filling gaps that remain. This is the task that i2S has set for itself.
