Welcome to the April-June 2025 i2S News with the latest developments in Integration and Implementation Sciences (i2S).

In this i2S News we are organising the material presented under the following headings:

There are three updates on the i2S theoretical framework covering research approaches, imperfection, and trust. Progress on moving i2S materials to the i2Insights website is also reported.

Nineteen tools for tackling complex problems were added to either i2Insights blog and repository or i2S-Talks in the following main topics: change, decision making, diversity, integration, research implementation, stakeholder engagement, systems and teamwork.

In strengthening the research and education community, there is a description of measuring progress through statistical analysis of i2Insights blog and repository, as well as providing an update of links (through i2S-Talks) among networks.

Other updates and resources present two new videos featuring a South–North dialogue and pioneering teaching efforts, as well as two new blog posts discussing artificial intelligence.

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i2S THEORETICAL FRAMEWORK

Updates on research approaches, imperfection and trust

An [infographic and brief description of the i2S theoretical framework](#) was developed in 2024 and fleshing this out is an on-going activity.

STRENGTHENING THE RESEARCH AND EDUCATION COMMUNITY

Update on what statistical analysis of i2Insights blog and repository tells us

Every three months an analysis is undertaken of author, viewer and other statistics for i2Insights blog and repository, and this provides some insights into the growth of the community developing and using tools to tackle complex societal and environmental problems. In particular to the end of March 2025, the statistics show that:

- there were 717 authors from 61 countries
- there have been viewers from all of the 193 nations that are members of the United Nations.

The webinar dialogue on “Transdisciplinarity and Sustainability” covers the concept of transdisciplinary–related theory, methods and practice, as well as transdisciplinary work that aims to bridge the gap between knowledge and action, and the co-production of knowledge towards sustainability. The dialogue was between Sharachandra Lele, Distinguished Fellow, Ashoka Trust for Research in Ecology and the Environment (ATREE) in India and Gabriele Bammer, Professor, Australian National University. Not shown in the video is vibrant participation from the audience of 65 people. The dialogue was co-hosted by the Indian Society for Ecological Economics (INSEE) and Global Alliance for Inter- and Transdisciplinarity (ITD- Alliance) on 26 February 2025. The webinar on “Transforming undergraduate learning: Teaching transdisciplinarity on a university-wide scale” features Giedre Kligyte (University of Technology Sydney) and Chris Browne (The Australian National University). They describe and discuss their universities’ pioneering efforts—which they lead—in embedding transdisciplinary capabilities at the undergraduate level. The session concluded with a Talanoa (open discussion), which gave the audience a chance to speak about their diverse interests and perspectives. - effective *decision making*
- *research implementation*
- understanding the processes involved in *change*.

For interacting effectively:

- improving *communication*
- *teamwork*
- *stakeholder engagement*.
