Welcome to the October-December 2025 i2S News with the latest developments in Integration and Implementation Sciences (i2S).

As well as providing the usual update of tools for tackling complex societal and environmental problems, this issue focuses on the 10th birthday of Integration and Implementation Insights (i2Insights) toolkit, which we celebrated on November 25th, 2025.

There are three items related to the 10th birthday celebrations:

The focus of i2S is therefore to provide new tools, as well as compiling and sharing existing tools, in 11 main areas as described below.

For developing a more comprehensive understanding of the complex problem and potential actions:

- taking a *systems* perspective
- understanding *context*
- understanding and managing *unknowns*
- incorporating, harnessing and managing *diversity*

- *integration* of multiple and varied perspectives about any problem and insights into acting on it.

For supporting policy and practice improvement by government, business and civil society:

- effective *decision making*
- *research implementation*
- understanding the processes involved in *change*.

For interacting effectively:

- improving *communication*
- *teamwork*
- *stakeholder engagement*.
